Pursuant to Public Act 11-152 An Act Concerning Domestic Violence, our records indicate that you are ineligible to possess a firearm.

Connecticut General Statutes Section 29-36k further requires that within two business days of such occurrence you:

1. **Transfer**, in accordance with Public Act 11-152 and C.G.S. § 29-33, all pistols, revolvers and firearms you possess to a federally-licensed firearms dealer pursuant to the sale of the pistol, revolver or other firearms;
OR
2. **Deliver or surrender** any/all firearms to any Connecticut State Police Troop – not to include Troop W (Bradley Int. Airport) or Headquarters in Middletown.

Should you deliver or surrender your handgun(s)/Firearms to the Connecticut State Police, you have up to one year to legally transfer them to an eligible person. If, after one year, you have not transferred the handguns (s)/firearm(s) held by the State Police, the weapon(s) may be destroyed.

You are hereby ordered to comply with the requirements of these statutes immediately. Criminal possession of a firearm is a Class D Felony. Your non-compliance will result in prosecution for this crime.

NOTE: You must immediately notify this office at (860) 685-8285, and the police department in the jurisdiction where you reside that you have completed the required transfer or surrender.

Should you choose to legally transfer per Public Act 11-152, you must supply this office with a completed DPS-3-C sale or transfer form for each weapon (that is 4 copies for each weapon – 1 of these to this office). Should you choose to surrender, you are required to supply this office with a receipt from the Connecticut State Police Troop where the surrender was made.

This letter authorizes you to transport the weapons without a permit solely for the purpose of allowing you to comply with this order.
